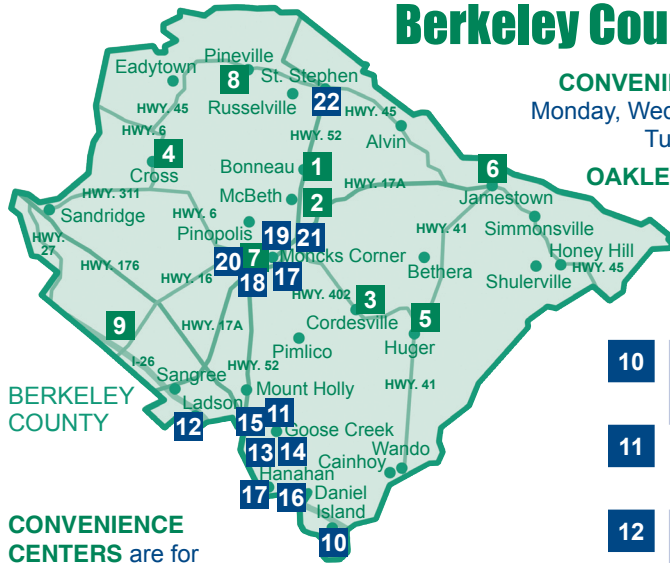


Berkeley County Recycling Locations

Why recycle?

TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES

- For each ton of recycled glass used to make new glass, nine gallons of fuel are saved.
- When paper is made from recycled fibers, 58 percent less water is used – compared to making paper from raw materials.

TO SAVE ENERGY

- One aluminum can saves enough energy to power a television set for one hour.
- Two gallons of used motor oil has enough energy to power the average home for 24 hours.

TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE

- It cost taxpayers millions of dollars to construct new landfills. The less that goes into a landfill, the longer it will last.

ALUMINUM AND STEEL CANS	Aluminum beverage cans and foil, pie pans and steel "tin" food and aerosol cans	Rinse. Labels do not need to be removed. Aerosol cans must be empty.	All Convenience Centers and Drop-off Sites
ANTIFREEZE			Gravel Hill Rd. and Oakley Rd. Convenience Centers
APPLIANCES (WHITE GOODS) AND SCRAP METAL	All appliances with metal parts (stoves, washers and dryers, refrigerators, grills and bicycles, etc.)		All Convenience Centers
BATTERIES, LEAD-ACID	Used automotive, marine and lawn mower batteries		All Convenience Centers
BATTERIES, NI-CD	Rechargeable batteries from cordless phones, cell phones, cameras, laptops, etc.		All Convenience Centers
CARDBOARD	Corrugated cardboard with NO wax finish (used for packing and shipping)	Flatten.	See the list of locations on the right.
CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION (C&D) DEBRIS	Lumber, drywall, window frames and other scrap building materials	Limit ½ ton (a pick-up load or one 10-foot single-axle trailer load) per visit.	All Convenience Centers
FURNITURE	Chairs, sofas, mattresses, etc.		All Convenience Centers
GASOLINE/OIL MIXTURES			Charity Church Rd., Gravel Hill Rd., Oakley Rd. and Ranger Dr. Convenience Centers
GLASS	Clear, green, brown and blue glass bottles and jars	Rinse. Window glass, pottery, porcelain and china ARE NOT accepted for recycling.	All Convenience Centers and Drop-off Sites
NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES, OFFICE PAPER, BROWN BAGS, PAPERBOARD, PASTEBOARD AND OTHER PAPER	Dry newspapers, inserts, brown paper bags, unwanted mail, catalogs, paperback books, gift paper, magazines, cereal boxes, soda cartons, shoe boxes, etc.	DO NOT tie or bag. Covers from hardback books should be removed; inside pages may be recycled.	All Convenience Centers and Drop-off Sites
PLASTIC CONTAINERS	All plastic containers marked by a recycling symbol with a number 1 to 5 (usually found on the bottom) – e.g., soft drink and water bottles, milk jugs, detergent bottles	Rinse and dry. Plastic grocery bags, flower pots and Styrofoam (although they may have a recycling symbol) ARE NOT accepted.	All Convenience Centers and Drop-off Sites
TEXTILES (CLOTHING)	Shirts, coats, pants, dresses, hats, etc.	Keep dry.	Oakley Rd. Convenience Center ONLY
TIRES	Tires from passenger vehicles	Limit five tires per day per resident.	All Convenience Centers
USED MOTOR OIL, OIL BOTTLES AND OIL FILTERS	Used motor oil, filters and bottles (oil must be free of gasoline or diesel fuel) and other petroleum products (see list on the right)	Limit 5 gallons per visit.	Convenience Centers
YARD TRIMMINGS	Leaves, tree limbs, etc.		All Convenience Centers

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE		Please bag all garbage.	All Convenience Centers

Convenience Center Rules

- Household waste is accepted ONLY from BERKELEY COUNTY RESIDENTS.
- NO SCAVENGING.
- ONLY pickup-sized vehicles are allowed.
- Single-axle trailers (10-foot or less) are allowed at the convenience centers. All others must use the landfill.
- The maximum amount of waste accepted at a convenience center is a ½ ton. A ½ ton is considered to be about a pickup load or one 10-foot single-axle trailer load. Combinations of pickup and trailer loads must use the landfill.
- Customers are responsible for unloading and placing waste in the proper containers.
- NO LOITERING.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Children must be attended to at all times.
- Recycling is encouraged. Please use the containers provided.
- Special waste disposal must be coordinated with staff at the landfill.
- Police have jurisdiction at all sites.
- Swap shops will accept only items suitable for reuse. Textiles are not accepted at the swap shops.

Cardboard Recycling Locations

Cardboard is accepted at the following Berkeley County recycling locations:

- **CONVENIENCE CENTERS:** Alligator Rd.; Charity Church Rd.; Gravel Hill Rd.; Hwy. 45/Pineville; Poplar Hill Rd.; Savannah Creek; Shulerville/Honey Hill; Oakley Rd.; and Ranger Drive.
- **DROP-OFF SITES:** Berkeley Intermediate School; College Park Middle School; Family Circle Tennis Center; Goose Creek; Hanahan Fire Department; Hanahan Middle School; and Macedonia Middle School.
